Background and implementation modalities

- ➤ Broad objective of RPTC: Support and advance processes aimed at developing the capacity of Governments (upon request) to formulate and implement policies for sustainable economic and social development.
- Short-term capacity-building activities and advisory services that are aligned with the programme and mandate of the Secretariat entity (ESCAP).
- ➤ Implementation modalities include advisory services, training workshops, seminars, fellowships, field projects.



Rapid Response Facility

- ➤ Established in 2017 to support SDG Policy and Action in Asia-Pacific through innovative regional and subregional approaches
- > Support member States in their efforts to implement the 2030 Agenda in line with the ESCAP offer of support at the national level:
 - Follow-up and Review
 - Leave No One Behind
 - Building Resilience to Risks
 - Greening Economic Recovery and Development
 - Financing and Investment for Development
 - Strengthening Trade, Transport and Digital Connectivity
 - Data and Statistics for Policy Making

ESCAP Visiting Fellows Pilot Programme

- 1) Strengthen the knowledge and skills of participants to address issues related to sustainable development;
- 2) Build capacity including through on-the-job learning experience on addressing critical and emerging issues in sustainable development in a multilateral and multicultural environment by working in teams with UN officials;
- 3) Familiarize participants with the work of the United Nations ESCAP.



Key features of the Programme

- 1) Open to developing countries from Asia and the Pacific with priority given to Countries in Special Situations
- 2) Junior-to-mid level officials nominated by their Governments
- 3) Selected by ESCAP against TORs
- 4) 9 months plus possibility of 9 months extension
- 5) Expert on mission status, not staff member
- 6) Salaries and health insurance paid by their governments
- 7) Travel related expenses and stipend paid by ESCAP
